

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 2

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROVIDING A TEMPORARY INCREASE IN SPENDING AUTHORITY FOR CERTAIN DESIGNATED EMPLOYEES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 22-219 on September 24, 2022, declaring that a state of emergency exists in every county in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Port Orange has declared a Local State of Emergency beginning September 26, 2022 at 3:30 p.m. pursuant to Resolution 22-31; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane Ian Storm Event may cause damage to public utilities, public buildings, public streets and roads, public drainage systems, potentially other public infrastructure, commercial and residential buildings and areas as well as causing life threatening conditions for the residents; and

WHEREAS, City employees need the ability to make emergency purchases in preparation for and in response to the Hurricane Ian Storm Event to protect the health, safety and welfare of the residents.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordered by the Emergency Management Director of the City of Port Orange, Volusia County, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. The purchasing card (P-Card) limits for the following employees shall be increased to \$50,000.00 for expenditures incurred in preparation for or in response to the Hurricane Ian Storm Event: Jill Poolman, Joseph Castro, Jennifer Cox, Julia Wiggins, Garrett McCafferty, Donald Denney, Tom DiEulio, Kevin Sweat, Teresa Wiggins, Susan Lovallo, Peter Ferreira, Cynthia Burgess, John McKinney, Monica Melendez, Walter Combee and Luke Grasburger.

SECTION 2. Emergency purchases shall be made in accordance with existing City policy and only with appropriate authorization.

SECTION 3. This Executive Order shall become effective immediately and shall expire at the conclusion of the declaration of emergency, as may be extended.
