EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 3

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR SUSPENSION OF YARD WASTE AND RECYCLING; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 22-219 on September 24, 2022, declaring that a state of emergency exists in every county in the State of Florida; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Port Orange has declared a Local State of Emergency beginning September 26, 2022 at 3:30 p.m. pursuant to Resolution 22-31; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane Ian Storm Event may cause damage to public utilities, public buildings, public streets and roads, public drainage systems, potentially other public infrastructure, commercial and residential buildings and areas as well as causing life threatening conditions for the residents; and

WHEREAS, Sec. 26-71 of the Code of Ordinances prohibits any person from placing garbage, trash, debris or refuse, is placed or present adjacent to the pavement or travel way of the street, alley or road at any time after the last scheduled pick-up during a declared emergency; and

WHEREAS, the City's solid waste contractor will complete its last scheduled pickup on September 28, 2022, consistent with its usual schedule; and

WHEREAS, the City's solid waste contractor will suspend its services (not pickup) on Thursday, September 29, and Friday, September 30, 2022.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordered by the Emergency Management Director of the City of Port Orange, Volusia County, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. The City's last scheduled pick-up of yard trash shall be September 28, 2022. The City hereby suspends all solid waste services for Thursday, September 29, 2022, and Friday, September 30, 2022. It shall be a violation of Sec. 26-71 of the Code of Ordinances to place, or permit to be present, any garbage, trash, debris or refuse, adjacent to the pavement or travel way of the street, alley or road at any time after the last scheduled pick-up.

SECTION 2. This Executive Order shall become effective immediately.
