

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 4 (NICOLE)

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, TEMPORARILY SUSPENDING UTILITY SHUT-OFFS AND LATE FEES FOR DELINQUENT UTILITY ACCOUNTS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 22-253, declaring that a state of emergency exists in Volusia County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Port Orange has declared a Local State of Emergency beginning November 8, 2022 at 4:30 p.m. pursuant to Resolution 22-42; and

WHEREAS, the Subtropical Storm Nicole Storm Event may cause damage to public utilities, public buildings, public streets and roads, public drainage systems, potentially other public infrastructure, commercial and residential buildings and areas as well as causing life threatening conditions for the residents; and

WHEREAS, City Hall will be closed at noon on November 9th, 2022 through November 14th, 2022, impacting the ability for utility customers to pay utility bills; and

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Director has determined that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Port Orange to extend the utility shut-off for delinquent utility accounts and all late fees imposed for delinquent utility accounts.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordered by the Emergency Management Director of the City of Port Orange, Volusia County, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. The City of Port Orange shall not process utility shut-offs for delinquent utility accounts until November 28th, 2022. All late fees incurred for delinquent utility accounts from the effective date of this Order through December 8th, 2022 shall be waived.

SECTION 2. This Executive Order shall become effective immediately.
