EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 14 (NICOLE)

AN EXECUTIVE ORDER OF THE EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, EXTENDING THE LOCAL STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR AN ADDITIONAL SEVEN (7) DAY PERIOD; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2022, Governor Ron DeSantis issued Executive Order Number 22-253, declaring that a state of emergency exists in Volusia County, Florida; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Port Orange has declared a Local State of Emergency beginning November 8, 2022 at 4:30 p.m. pursuant to Resolution 22-42; and

WHEREAS, the Hurricane Nicole Storm Event caused or may have caused damage to public utilities, public buildings, public streets and roads, public drainage systems, potentially other public infrastructure, commercial and residential buildings and areas as well as causing life threatening conditions for the residents; and


WHEREAS, this damage continues to cause a local state of emergency.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordered by the Emergency Management Director of the City of Port Orange, Volusia County, Florida, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Local State of Emergency declared by City Council on November 8, 2022 at 4:30 p.m. is hereby extended for an additional seven (7) day period to January 3, 2023 at 4:30 p.m., unless otherwise terminated by resolution of City Council or subsequent executive order.

SECTION 2. This Executive Order shall become effective immediately.
