

## FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for the City of Port Orange's replacement of a fiberglass filter cover at the Wastewater Plant due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 06931). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 06, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

- Floodplain:** Project is located in the Shaded Zone X, otherwise known as the 500 year floodplain, per Volusia County FIRM Panel #12127C0388J dated 09/29/2017.
- Proposed Work and Purpose:** The City of Port Orange will replace a fiberglass filter cover at the Wastewater Plant to bring facility back to pre-disaster condition. No Section 406 Hazard Mitigation project is proposed.
- Project Alternatives:** No project alternatives are being considered. The fiberglass filter cover cannot be practicably relocated because it must be installed on the filter; an alternative action is not practicable because there is no action that can serve the same purpose and have less potential to affect or be affected by the floodplain; and a no action alternative is not practicable because the filter cover is necessary to increase the useful life of the facility.
