**Port Orange Police Department**  
**Bike Week 2006**  
**After Action Report**

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On February 9, 2006 the two Florida Department of Transportation permits regarding the lane closures and alterations on US-1 were completed and signed.

The permit, design and alterations were in within index 623 of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Design.

Cones, barricades and light towers were delivered to the two locations on Friday March 3<sup>rd</sup>. They were not placed into full use until Saturday March 4<sup>th</sup>. (Due to past traffic volume records)

Bike Week 2006 officially started on Friday March 3<sup>rd</sup> and ran through Sunday March 12<sup>th</sup>. The weather was extremely favorable for the entire 10-day event with sunny skies and high 70 to low 80-degree temperatures.

**Places of interest within the City of Port Orange were:**

Nova Campground, The Port Hole, First Turn Lounge and the Last Resort. Each of these locations was staffed by hired (off-duty, detail) Port Orange Police Officers.

**Nova Campground** – Officers worked from Friday March 3 to Saturday March 11, 10:00 pm to 6:00 am. No significant problems were reported.

**The Port Hole** – Officers worked from Monday March 6 through Saturday March 11, 10:00 pm to 2:00 am. Noted problems are listed below:

Noise complaints:

Event # 31816 – Band playing at 10:17 pm on March 2<sup>nd</sup>.

Case # 2311 – Loud music at 6:05 pm on March 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Case # 2318 – Complaint advised he heard the music from his home located on Deer Springs road (Madeline) at 8:57 pm on March 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Case # 2320 – Loud Music playing at 9:03 pm on March 3<sup>rd</sup>.

Event # 33656 – Report of loud music at 10:39 pm on March 5<sup>th</sup>.

Event # 34289 – Report of people yelling and music playing at 12:33 am on March 7<sup>th</sup>.

Case # 2639 – Report of loud music at 8:59 pm on March 11<sup>th</sup>. The detail officer on site did not observe any violations and the band was not playing at the time.

**First Turn Lounge** – Officers worked from Tuesday March 7 through Saturday March 11, 4:30 pm to 10:30 pm. Other than a structure fire that occurred on Tuesday March 7, at 5:50 pm, there were no other incidents or problems at this location. The fire required the assistance of Ponce Inlet and New Smyrna Fire Departments and closed the southbound lanes of US-1 from 6:00 pm to 8:30 pm.

**The Last Resort** – Officers worked traffic details from Saturday March 4 through Saturday March 11, 12:00 pm to 10:00 pm. On Thursday March 9<sup>th</sup> at 3:00 pm a cream corn-wrestling event was held. There were no significant problems during this event other than traffic congestion. On Saturday March 11<sup>th</sup> the Last Resort held a Chopper show from noon to approximately 7:00 pm. This drew an extremely large crowd.

Total citations issued for the period of Friday March 3<sup>rd</sup> thru Saturday March 11<sup>th</sup> - 179  
This is an increase of 59 citations compared to Bike Week 2005.

**Notable – serious – crashes during the 10-day period:**

978 Sandlewood, single motorcycle crash. The local resident is still in serious condition at Halifax Medical Center. A Traffic Homicide Investigation is pending on the male and his outcome. Alcohol and speed is believed to be a factor.

Traffic Homicide in the 1100 block of Herbert, POPD case 2006-2601. Male (from Virginia) exited the Nova Campground on Friday March 10<sup>th</sup> at 8:12 pm and proceeded east on Herbert at a high rate of speed drifting into the westbound lane and striking a westbound motorcycle carrying two passengers from New York. The single male driver expired at the scene from massive head injuries. The other two victims were transported to Halifax Medical Center via Air One. Both were in critical condition with massive leg trauma. (As of Wednesday March 15<sup>th</sup> at 9:30 am, both are expected to survive) Herbert Street was closed from 8:12 pm to 10:45 pm.

**Motorcycle Thefts:**

958 Village Trail on Sunday March 12<sup>th</sup> POPD case 2006-2677 a male reported his 2004 Yamaha motorcycle stolen from the location.

**DWLS** – Case # 2594 Local male arrested for driving while license suspended. 3600 Herbert. March 10<sup>th</sup>.

**Narcotics** – Case # 2630 Out of state male arrested for possession of Marijuana. 90 Dunlawton. March 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Overtime Use:**

The Port Orange Police Department worked a total of **291** hours of overtime during the 10-day event. The breakdown is as follows:

The traffic unit was approved for **67.50** hours of overtime. We only used a total of **57** hours due to an officer resigning just prior to bike week.

**234** hours were used at local businesses that paid for the hours.

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The following is a list of the Special Event permit holders and any complaints or violations that were received or observed by the Community Development Department.

Black Hills Saloon/Port Orange Flea Market – 5005-5009 Ridgewood Avenue

This location had one vendor. No complaints or violations.

First Turn Lounge and Grille – 5236 Ridgewood Avenue

This location had two vendors. No complaints or violations.

Last Resort Bar and Properties – 5812 Ridgewood Avenue

This location had sixteen vendors. No complaints or violations.

Bootsie's Hideaway – 3400 S. Nova Road

This location had one vendor. No complaints or violations.

Port Hole Lounge – 928 & 956 Herbert Street

This location had one vendor. The Community Improvement Division did not receive any complaints regarding this location; although, noise complaints were received through the Mayor's and City Manager's office.

The Community Development Department staff (supervisory, code compliance, and office) spent a total of approximately 34 hours preparing for and implementing the Special Event permits and Temporary Merchant Licenses. Included in that time is preparation of staff reports for the City Council, pre-inspections as well as inspections during the event, and inspections to close out the permits as relates to garbage and debris removal and returning

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the site to its original condition. An approximate cost in salary averages for 34 hours is \$850.00. There was less time inspecting the special event sites that did not have many vendors but more time devoted to the Port Hole, which averaged out to be about the same cost as Bike Week 2005.

According to accounting records, we received \$5500 for Temporary Merchant licenses. A total of 22 vendors participated in the Bike Week event. By adding \$2500 received for Special Event permits, the total amount of cash receipts from the Community Development Department for Bike Week 2006 is \$8000.

I have attached a copy of the Public Works Special Project Summary for Bike Week covering the dates from March 3 through March 13, 2006. This report provides detailed information in regards to man-hours and equipment costs. It is staff's understanding that the Public Works Department absorbed the costs involved with providing traffic control devices as in the past. Additionally, the Police Department is preparing their after-action report for the event, which will be presented separately.
