A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PORT ORANGE, VOLUSIA COUNTY, FLORIDA, ADOPTING THE MESSAGE BOARD POLICY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City has established a Policy for the use of the entry message board at Dunlawton and City Center and the portable message boards; and

WHEREAS, the City staff has established the Message Board Policy for the use of these message boards; and


WHEREAS, the City staff recommends that the City Council review and accept the attached policy.



Exhibit "A"

Use of the Message Boards at City Center

It is the policy of the City Council that only sponsored and co-sponsored activities held at City Center shall be eligible to be advertised on the entry message board and portable message signs at Dunlawton and City Center, Clyde Morris Boulevard and City Center, and Herbert Street and City Center. Additionally, special events sponsored by and held at the Port Orange Regional Library shall be eligible to publicize on the entry message board. In order for organizations such as the Port Orange YMCA and Palmer Chiropractic College to use the entry or portable message boards, they must submit the message to the City at least 30 days prior to the planned event for City Council authorization. The City Council in its sole discretion can approve or deny the request by the YMCA and Palmer to have their message placed on the entry sign or the portable sign boards. If there are event conflicts, the City-sponsored or co-sponsored events will be advertised first, regardless of when applications are received from other eligible users. If no City event is scheduled, then the event whose application was received first shall have first priority.

All other off-site events shall not be eligible to publicize their events, programs, or activities on the entry signage at City Center.
